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Abstract

Interviewer administered questionnaire was household survey. A sample of fifty cases were control approach. Eighty two percents upto four months. Children who received 2 weeks was consistently lower (16.5% - 15.5%) any kind of diseases. Upto twelve weeks, 12% for partial breast feeding and 12% for full breast feeding. After twelve weeks eighty seven percent of children were received cow's milk instead of breast milk. Out of fifty cases 63% had powdered milk fed compared with children fed with breast milk. Semi solid feeding after 14 weeks was probably of weight gain compared with breast milk (mean body weight 5.5 Kg (5.0 - 5.5) (95% confidence interval 41.5% - 50.7%) of children.
